Clean Fuels Alliance America (Clean Fuels) Membership Packet

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SECTION A

CLEAN FUELS MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Corporate Purpose

Clean Fuels is a non-profit trade association that exists to promote public acceptance and confidence in biodiesel and RHD, to the end of commercial success for all.

Biodiesel

means the mono alkyl esters of long-chain fatty acids that are derived from animal fats or vegetable oils and that meets or exceeds the specifications of ASTM D6751 or any legal successor thereto.

Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel (“RHD”)

means the hydrocarbon fuel derived from renewable material that meets the specifications of ASTM D975 or its legal successor and also meets the properties below:

- i. Oxidation Stability: ASTM D2274 (16h @ 95°); 2.5mg/100mL maximum; and
- ii. Oxygen Content: ASTM E385; 100 ppm maximum.

Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel is produced in a facility dedicated exclusively to the production of biomass-based diesel as defined in the RFS2 rules of the EPA. It does not include co-processed renewable fuel.

Eligibility

Membership in Clean Fuels may be granted to any Feedstock Producer Organization, Biodiesel or Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Producer, Biodiesel or Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Marketer, Organization who is supportive of the purposes of Clean Fuels. Applicants may be granted membership as outlined in the Clean Fuels Membership Admission Procedure. There shall be two classes of Members: Voting Members and Nonvoting Members.

“Biodiesel” means the Mono Alkyl-Esters of long-chain fatty acids derived from animal fats or vegetable oils that meet the specifications of ASTM D-6751 or its legal successor.

“Feedstock Producer Organization” mean the producers of feedstock for either biodiesel or renewable hydrocarbon diesel.

“Fuel” means both biodiesel and renewable hydrocarbon diesel.

“Industry” refers to both the biodiesel and the renewable hydrocarbon diesel industries.

“Marketer” means both a Biodiesel Marketer and a Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Marketer.

“Producer” means both a Biodiesel Producer and a Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Producer.

“Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Producer” means a person who produces Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel in a facility dedicated exclusively to the production of biomass-based diesel as defined in the RFS2 rules of the EPA.

“Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel Marketer” means a person who markets Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel produced in a facility dedicated exclusively to the production of biomass-based diesel as defined in the RFS2 rules of the EPA.



Membership Approval Procedure

Upon receipt of a completed Clean Fuels Membership Application Form, a check for the appropriate Minimum Annual Dues and a Certificate of Analysis from an accredited laboratory demonstrating compliance with ASTM D6751*, Clean Fuels shall act expeditiously on the application pursuant to the procedure detailed in the Clean Fuels Admission Policy.

Requirements for Admission to Membership

All applications for membership are subject to acceptance and approval by Clean Fuels. Clean Fuels will approve an application for membership if Clean Fuels determines that the applicant is eligible and that approval is in the best interests of Clean Fuels. Clean Fuels reserves the right to determine the most appropriate class of membership for an applicant and reserves the right to reclassify a member to another class of membership as deemed appropriate. An applicant shall not be admitted to Membership until the applicant has satisfied the requirements of the Clean Fuels Membership Admission Policy.

Clean Fuels Definition; Certificate of Analysis

Because the definition of renewable diesel is not yet firmly fixed in this country, Clean Fuels has established its own definition (See previous paragraph). Because Clean Fuels has had to adopt its own definition for renewable diesel, an RHD Producer or Marketer applying for Clean Fuels Membership must submit with its Membership Application a Certificate of Analysis (COA) of its RHD from a qualified industry lab demonstrating compliance with the Clean Fuels definition above.*

Voting Membership Class

Feedstock Producer Organization

One Voting Membership shall be granted for each fiscal year for each Feedstock Producer Organization which has paid to the Corporation a minimum \$10,000 contribution for the fiscal year.

Producer; Marketer

One Voting Membership shall be granted for each fiscal year for each Producer or Marketer that pays to the Corporation a minimum of \$2,500 dues based upon the following annual volume produced or upon gallons purchased from a non-Clean Fuels member, whether or not intended for export, and whether or not imported from another country. In a toll-manufacturing situation, the party whose EPA Registration is being used for production shall be deemed the Producer for purposes of these Bylaws.



Dues

Clean Fuels operates on a fiscal year that starts on October 1 of each year and ends on September 30 of the following year. All dues payments are geared to this schedule. Dues are not tax deductible as charitable deductions but may be tax deductible as ordinary and necessary business expenses. Initial Dues will be prorated to the fiscal year quarter in which Membership is granted. An eligible dues payor must pay according to the following:

Feedstock Producer Organization:

\$10,000 per Clean Fuels fiscal year.

Two or more Feedstock Producer Organizations may pool their contributions to meet or exceed the minimum \$10,000 dues and, having done so, may jointly appoint the Voting Member to whom they are thereupon entitled.

Producer; Marketer:

\$2,500 per Clean Fuels fiscal year.

Additionally, on gallons above 312,500, members must pay Volume Dues based upon the cumulative annual volume of production, as follows:

Total Volume Produced During Clean Fuels' Fiscal Year	Current Fiscal Year (Gallons)	Volume Dues
0 to 10,000,000 gallons	\$.008 per gallon	(\$80,000)
10,000,001 to 30,000,000	\$.003 per gallon	(\$60,000)
Amounts over 30,000,000	\$.001 per gallon	

[Example: A Producer that produces or Marketer that purchases from non-Clean Fuels members 65 million gallons would pay \$175,000 in annual dues (\$80,000 + 60,000+35,000.)]

Monthly Volume Report; Volume Dues. Producers and Marketers will be invoiced for their \$2,500 Minimum Annual Dues at the beginning of each fiscal year. This \$2,500 is due on October 1. Producers and Marketers must submit to Clean Fuels Monthly Volume Reports of cumulative gallons produced, tolled, and/or purchased from non-Clean Fuels members to date during the current fiscal year, by the 20th of the following month (i.e.: report for October will be due by November 20th). Each report will separately note the volumes of fuel produced, tolled, or purchased from a non-Clean Fuels member, whether or not intended for export, and whether or not imported from another country. Volumes produced at each individual production plant will be separately reported. This is done electronically on the Clean Fuels website.

When the reported cumulative volume produced, tolled, and/or purchased from non-Clean Fuels members during the year-to-date has exceeded 312,500 gallons, then Volume Dues must be paid in accordance with the schedule above. Volume Dues are payable within 30 days of reporting the volumes which triggered them. For example, March volumes are reported by April 20. Any Volume Dues triggered by March volumes are due by May 20. Producers and Marketers will use the Monthly Volume Dues Report they generate as their invoice for any dues payable. Information on volumes reported shall be restricted pursuant to the Clean Fuels Confidentiality Policy.

Organization:

\$2,500 per Clean Fuels fiscal year.



Fuel Sales Among Clean Fuels Producers/Marketers

For purposes of calculating Volume Dues payments, gallons of biodiesel and/or RHD that are sold among Clean Fuels Members shall be counted only once. Volume Dues on such sales shall be paid only by the first Clean Fuels Member involved in the transaction (whether the Member produces the fuel, purchases it, or simply brokers it).

Volume Dues Auditing Policy

Clean Fuels shall have access to the Member's books and records relevant to the proper payment of Volume Dues. If a Volume Dues audit reveals the Member has underpaid Clean Fuels by more than 10% of the amount due, the Member shall be assessed and liable for the costs of the audit. All information accessed by the audit shall remain restricted pursuant to the Clean Fuels Confidentiality Policy.

Delegates and Alternates

Voting Members - In order to operate knowledgeably, efficiently and consistently in the best interests of the industry, the dues-paying legal entity must appoint a Primary and Alternate individual to consistently serve at Clean Fuels meetings.

Either the primary or alternate individual will be its Voting Delegate. This person must be an officer or agent of the dues-paying entity with full authority to vote on all matters coming before the Voting Members of Clean Fuels.

Proper and timely payment of all dues allows the Member to be a Member of Clean Fuels. If a legal entity, proper and timely payment of dues allows the Member to designate an individual to be a Delegate to Clean Fuels. Nonpayment of dues is grounds for membership discipline, including suspension or revocation of membership. Appropriate Minimum Annual Dues must accompany all membership applications.

Meeting Attendance

Faithful attendance at meetings is necessary for Clean Fuels to act faithfully for the benefit of the industry. Proper attendance at a Clean Fuels meeting that fails for lack of a quorum is a waste of time for those Members who took the time to faithfully attend, and accomplishes nothing for the industry.

Important Notice: A Clean Fuels Member, through its Voting Delegate or Alternate, is encouraged to attend all meetings, and expected to attend at least half of all Clean Fuels meetings.



Clean Fuels Governing Structure

Clean Fuels' Governing Board consists of 15 Directors elected by and from Voting Members.

Regular Membership Meetings

Regular meetings for the entire membership shall be held at such time, place, and date as the Governing Board may determine. Notice of such regularly scheduled meetings including date, time, and location shall be given at least ten (10) calendar days in advance of any regular meeting by mailing first class, by emailing, or by faxing to the address or facsimile number supplied by the Member. Any official business to be conducted shall require a quorum as set forth below.

Special Membership Meetings

Special meetings of the members may be called for any purpose by the Chair or by the Governing Board, and shall be called by the Chair at the request of any ten (10) members in good standing. At least ten (10) days notice of the special meeting shall be given to all eligible Voting Members by first class mail, by email, or by faxing to the address or facsimile number supplied by the Member.

SECTION B

CLEAN FUELS MEMBERSHIP ADMISSION POLICY

Biodiesel and Renewable Hydrocarbon Diesel (RHD) are renewable biomass-based diesel fuels competing for market share in a mature and highly competitive market. Clean Fuels is a non-profit trade association that exists to promote public acceptance and confidence in Biodiesel and RHD, to the end of commercial success for all. To advance this common goal, Clean Fuels will admit to Membership on a nondiscriminatory basis any industry member or supporter with a legitimate economic interest in the success of biodiesel or RHD, and who meets the Membership requirements. The Applicant must:

If applying for a **Voting Membership**, be either a:

- **Feedstock Producer Organization**
- **Producer; Marketer**

If producing biodiesel or RHD, it must be registered with the EPA pursuant to the Clean Air Act regulations found at 40 CFR Part 79. If applying for a Producer Membership but not yet in commercial production, Clean Fuels will proceed with admission to Producer Membership on this basis:

If applying for a **Nonvoting Organization Membership**, must be a company with a bona fide economic interest in the success of the industry and supportive of the purposes of Clean Fuels. Common examples of those fitting this description are, but not limited to:

- **Industry technology, chemical, process, and petroleum suppliers**
- **Expert consultants**
- **Research and Development organizations**
- **Industry trade organizations and related businesses**
- **Biodiesel or RHD stakeholders not eligible for Voting Membership**
- **Biodiesel or RHD Marketers not required to register their fuel with the EPA because their upstream suppliers have already registered the Biodiesel or RHD.**



Applicant Affirmations and Attestations

An applicant must:

Affirm that it will be represented at Clean Fuels meetings at its own expense by an officer or key employee of the dues-paying applicant with full authority to act on all matters coming before the Clean Fuels Voting Membership

Pay applicant's Minimum Annual Dues and thereafter pay its dues within thirty (30) days of invoice.

Signify applicant's intention to abide by the Articles of Incorporation, Bylaws, and Policies and Procedures of Clean Fuels.

Signify its intention to comply with the Clean Fuels Antitrust Compliance Policy.

Signify its intention to comply with the Clean Fuels Code of Ethics.

Signify its intention to comply with the Clean Fuels Fuel Quality Policy.

If a Producer; Marketer, submit required monthly **Volume Dues** reports of produced, tolled, or purchased gallons from non-Clean Fuels Members. If required, remit Volume Dues monthly. Note: Monthly Volume Dues Reports are required to be submitted even if production, tolls or purchased gallons are zero.

If a Producer of renewable fuel for the transportation market attest that it will process only biodiesel or RHD, as the case may be, that is registered with the EPA pursuant to the Clean Air Act regulations found at 40 CFR Part 79.

Affirm that neither the Applicant, nor any of its key employees have been found by any court of competent jurisdiction to have intentionally sold inferior biodiesel or renewable fuel or to have engaged in fraudulent, deceptive, or other illegal conduct that undermines consumer confidence in biodiesel or renewable fuel.

Affirm that neither the Applicant nor any of its key employees is involved in any pending bankruptcy or insolvency proceedings nor otherwise involved in financial problems that could reasonably be expected to undermine consumer confidence in its renewable fuel. If further inquiry into this criterion is required, any evaluation of an Applicant's creditworthiness shall be based on objective data only.

Membership will be granted to an Applicant meeting the above requirements.

Membership Admission Procedure

An Applicant for Clean Fuels Membership must submit a completed Application Form (Section D) and a check for appropriate Minimum Annual Dues. See the Application Form for specific details. Upon submission of all required documents, the Application Package will be distributed to the Clean Fuels Voting Members. Each Clean Fuels Voting Member will be given fourteen (14) calendar days from the date of distribution to file a Written Comment.

A Voting Member may comment if it believes the Applicant has conducted and will conduct its biodiesel or RHD business in a manner inconsistent with the exempt purposes of Clean Fuels. If after 14 days, staff has received no written comment, Applicant shall be admitted to Membership. If staff does receive written comment, it shall proceed as directed by Clean Fuels Chair after consultation with legal counsel.
